Behaviour Updates

Thank you to all the families who completed our behaviour questionnaire— this was very helpful and on the information that we received we have been able to start to make positive changes to our current system. We have started by introducing Class Dojo throughout the whole school. This new system replaces the merit system and allows pupils to gain points for meeting our school values: Being Kind and Gentle, Being Resilient and Brave and Being Ready to Learn. Our school staff can award points for only these three skills-plus one more skill which is decided by individual class teachers to help them work on a classroom target. This half term we shall be inviting parents and carers to see your child's Class Dojo points online and watch them increase over the year. This new system is to promote positive behaviour in school-and help the children to make good choices in order to achieve a reward. The more they show their adults in school that they are being kind and gentle, resilient and brave and ready to learn-the more they will be rewarded. This system will also support consistency through school and parents can see how well their children are managing their behaviours in school. Please see below the newly designed posters that show the children what their Class Dojo rewards will be. Children will be able to collect these prizes-and will be able to display their badges on their school jumpers when they have achieved them.

We have introduced Individual Success Plans, to be written where appropriate alongside parents and carers, to explore early warning signs and proactive strategies to support pupils to be more successful in school.
Ensure the reward system is fairer to all children	The new individual reward system has three new certificates (taking the total to six) and five prize levels so that all children are able to achieve some recognition over each school year for positive behaviour. See the poster below for more information.
Remove the traffic light system	We are currently conducting more research around this area of our behaviour policy with a view to change it from January 2026.
Improve behaviour during unstruc- tured times	Next half term, we will be training a group of Year 5 and 6 pupils to act as Play Leaders during lunchtime. This will develop their confidence and allows them to be strong role models to younger pupils while increasing physical activity.
